Fees and Deposits	2	Late registrants will be accepted only as space permits and will be charged a late registration fee of \$25.00. Registrants who have not paid fees in full by March 10 will be charged a late registration fee and late registrations will be accepted by appointment only (at a time and place to be designated by the Registrar – likely during tryouts at the Soccer Centre - and that will be posted on the Aurora website). Registrants who withdraw from playing will be charged a \$50.00 administration fee.

Fees and Uniform Deposit

Fees for all Under 12 to Under 16 Registration Fees: \$190 per player. Under 18 Registration fees: \$180 per player. In addition to the registration fee, a **separate \$50.00 cheque** is required as a uniform deposit for **each player registered**. These cheques should be post-dated to **August 1st, 2011** and will be held by the club until the return of the player's uniform at the end of the season. At that time the cheque will be returned. If the full uniform is not returned, this cheque will be used to recover the cost of unreturned items.

A **separate \$100.00 cheque** is required as a Volunteer deposit bond for **each family registered**. These cheques should be post-dated to **June 30, 2011** and will be held by the club until the end of the season. At that time the cheque will be returned if one of the adult family members has volunteered a minimum of 6 hours at the Harder Avalon Classic Tournament or is a member of the coaching staff, a manager, serving on the Board or any committee of the Board, or helps with evaluations, try-outs or other duties as required. If a member of the players family does not volunteer, this cheque will be used to cover the costs required to hire additional resources for the Club.

Your Registration Fees

Your soccer registration fees are very competitive with those paid for other sports and leisure activities. Even so, you may be interested in knowing how the amount is set. For the outdoor season, the fee is based on the team assessments made by Saskatoon Youth Soccer, which for this year include an increased fee to recover increased costs assessed by the Saskatchewan Soccer Association. These fees cover the staff time at SYSI required to organize the league and the registrations, schedule and assign fields, assign referees, and pay the referees. This sum also includes provincial registration fees which cover insurance for each participant. Prior to the beginning of the season, the Aurora Soccer Club breaks this out into a player-based fee, and adds its anticipated costs including the costs associated with evaluations, the registration process, training coaches, providing uniforms and purchasing and providing equipment. Based on that review, your Board carefully considered the anticipated expenses, and additional costs which will be carried by the Club for the coming year, which include the costs associated with developing and implementing an online registration system. and arrived at a registration fee for the 2011 outdoor season of \$190.00 per player.

Club Expectations of Parents and Players

As a member of Saskatoon Youth Soccer and the Saskatchewan Soccer Association, Aurora Soccer Club and its members are subject to requirements intended to ensure fair play and the integrity of the game. As the governing body for soccer in Zone 5, the Club has codified those and other expectations of its members in Codes of Conduct for its Board, Coaching Staff, Parents, and Players. To assist you in understanding the Club's expectations, the Codes for Parents and players are set forth below.

Parents

The following are the Club's expectations of parents:

- Treat officials, players, coaches and opponents with respect.
- Report significant medical conditions of the players to the coach and to the team manager.
- Encourage the players to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Teach the players that doing one's best is as important as winning, so that they will not feel defeated by the outcome of a game.
- Applaud good play by both teams.
- Respect and show appreciation for the volunteer coaches who give their time to provide sport activities for the players.
- Volunteer for activities as requested, including but not being limited to ***volunteering for the Harder Avalon Classic Tournament and the Saskatoon Field Marshall Program.***

Players

The following are the Club's expectations of players:

- Treat teammates, officials, coaches, parents, and opponents with respect.
- Notify coach or manager in advance when unable to attend games and practices.
- Show commitment at practices and games.
- Control their actions so that they do not put them-selves or other players at risk of injury.
- Volunteer for fundraising and other activities as requested.
- Complete Coach Evaluation forms at the end of the season and forward to the Technical Committee

Players Coming From Community Association Soccer

Aurora Soccer Club welcomes all players joining us from Community Association Soccer.

As you likely know, Saskatoon Youth Soccer conducts play in four divisions, from Premier through to Division 4. Players in the Aurora Soccer Club are evaluated to ensure that they are placed in a division commensurate with their ability, the goal being to provide an appropriate and enjoyable playing experience, and an opportunity to develop appropriate individual and team skills. As players progress, they are evaluated on an ongoing basis, and players will move between divisions on the basis of their skill level, attitude and commitment to the game.

Aurora Soccer Club will accept registration from underage players who wish to try to play with the Club's U12 teams. Underage players who have not played with the Club for a full season will be evaluated and will be offered a placement in U12 if evaluations show that they can properly be placed in Div 3 or above. Those players who are not offered placement will be released back to their Community Association for another season of play. ***We therefore recommend that all such underage players also register with their Community Association*** against this possibility.
